

Gloria: Respect Myself and Others



Badge Overview

Daisies earn petals that go around the Promise Center to complete their Daisy flower. The Gloria petal is one of ten petals you can earn, each representing a line of the Girl Scout Law. When you've earned your Gloria petal, you'll know how to respect yourself and others, just like Gloria the Morning Glory.

Badge Components

1. Talk about "Gloria's Story"

Earn this step by watching this <u>video</u> to hear Gloria's story—*A Surprise for Lily!* Then, answer the questions below.

- O How did Gloria show that she had respect for herself?
- O How did she show she had respect for others?
- What Girl Scout traditions (such as the quiet sign) show that you have respect for others?

2. Invite an older Girl Scout to talk to your group about ways to respect yourself and others

Earn this step at home by talking with a family member to come up with 2 ways you can respect yourself and 2 ways you can respect others. Do you do these things already? If not, would they be easy to start doing?

O **BONUS!** Next time you connect with your Daisy friends, share your ideas with them and see if they have any ideas of their own.

3. Practice respecting yourself and others

Earn this step by trying out the activity below or coming up with your own way to respect yourself and others!

O When you wake up, start your day by saying 1 thing you like about yourself! Try doing it every morning for a week or even longer.
