

Badge: Animal Habitats

Steps & Activities:

Step 1:

Oklahoma Wildlife:

- Do some research on wildlife found in Oklahoma and find answers to the following questions (Pick three animals):
 - o Do they only live in Oklahoma?
 - O What is their habitat?
 - O What do they eat?
 - o What part of Oklahoma do they live?
 - Here are some suggestions of animals to research:
 - Big brown bat
 - Black-tailed Jackrabbit
 - Eastern Mole
 - Easter Spotted Skunk
 - Eastern Woodrat
 - Fulvous Harvest Mouse
 - gray Bat
 - Indiana Bat
 - Mountain Lion
 - Nine-banded Armadillo
 - Porcupine
 - Woodchuck

Step 2: (Pick one)

Go to the Zoo!:

- There are lots of fun animals to learn about that live in Oklahoma, but there are also all kinds of cool animals living all over the world! Go to a local zoo, learn about the animals that live there by trying to find the answers to the following questions:
 - O What is their habitat?
 - O Where do they come from in the wild?
 - o What do they eat?
 - o Are they endangered?

Step 3 (Pick One):

Home Sweet Home:

- Picking either an animal you found at the Zoo, or one of the animals that live in Oklahoma, make their perfect habitat. You can use whatever materials you like but try and make it as close to their real habitat as possible.

You know how grown animals make their habitats, but what about their babies? Pick your favorite animal and find out what kind of home they make for their babies. Step 4:

- When animals no longer have their habitat, they must adapt to a new place to live. Some animals can't change where they live and become endangered.
 Answer the questions about one of the following places below:
 - o Why is it in danger?
 - o What is happening to the animals?
 - o What are people doing to help the habitat?
 - o Are the animals able to adapt?
