Badge Overview

Use your creativity and imagination to invent unforgettable games. When you've earned this badge, you'll be able to design and organize games that will bring people together for creative and thoughtful fun.

Badge Components

1. Break the ice

When you're with a group of people (especially if people in the group don't know each other), it's always a good idea to have an "icebreaker" activity to get everyone comfortable! Think of an icebreaker activity that your family (or friends via a virtual meeting) can do to start off this badge.

Example: You can use this bingo board by finding someone else in the group that has done what is written in the box and then write their name there. First to get bingo, wins!

2. Imagine all the world's a board

It's time to bring a game to life! Design a life-sized game board that uses the people playing the game as the game pieces.

This can either be based on your favorite board game or you can make one up based on your favorite book, hobby, or movie!

3. Create a physical challenge

Design an obstacle course using the items around your house! Use this <u>article</u> for some inspiration and to guide you through the process of creating a course.

Once it's complete, have you and your family run through it. Make sure to record everyone's time and see who got through it the quickest!

4. Get puzzled

Make a puzzle! Make a collage using different photos that you printed or from a magazine.

- Once your collage is complete, cut it into different pieces in the style of a puzzle.
- O Then, get your family to try and see if they can put it together!

5. Make an ultra scavenger hunt

Now, it's time to end this badge with a scavenger hunt!

- O Develop a list of 10 items either in your house or in your backyard for your family to find (people can be on teams or complete the hunt individually!).
- O These can be literal items or something that your family needs to take a photo of.
- O First person, or team, to find all 10 items wins!

- Basic art/craft supplies
- Photos printed or from a magazine

- Scissors
