Badge Overview

Through earning this badge, Seniors will explore the complex relationship between animals and humans as well as the issues facing animals and what they can do to help.

Badge Components

1. Find out about domestic animals

Think about the types of pets you and your friends have as well as other pets you have heard about.

- O Create a pets' rights document to protect these animals. Your document can focus on things like the treatment of pets or using pets for education.
- O Research the laws that protect pets in Florida using this link.

2. Learn about animals used for science

Explore this website to learn about animal research.

O Use a notebook to record some of the facts that interest you and your reaction to what you learn.

3. Explore animal husbandry

Animal husbandry includes raising livestock and selective breeding practices. Use your notebook to record your findings and your reactions as you look into the world of animal husbandry. You can start with these links:
